Hysteroscopy Keith B. Isaacson, M.D., Moderator

This session has been designed to provide the hysteroscopic surgeon with an understanding of how fluid management and the mechanical systems required to perform hysteroscopic surgery interact to affect outcomes. The hands-on portion will provide a strong foundation for reducing fluid management related complications and will also provide an understanding of the instrumentation required to perform hysteroscopy in the office as well as the operating room.

Objectives: 1) Describe the various hysteroscopic procedures; 2) describe various fluid media and physiologic reactions associated with each; 3) provide an understanding of the potential complications associated with fluid intravasation; and 4) provide an understanding of the various equipment required for hysteroscopic procedures.

Advanced Laparoscpic Techniques Resad P.Pasic, M.D., Ph.D., /Andrew I. Brill, M.D., Dobie L. Giles, M.D., Moderators

This is a practical, lecture-oriented scientific program in advanced gynecologic laparoscopy designed for AAGL fellows. The course will be taught by experts in the field of gynecologic endoscopy with a focus on the skills necessary for advanced laparoscopy.

Objectives: After completion of this course, participants will: 1) Increase their knowledge of female pelvic anatomy; 2) improve their endoscopic skills in performing laparoscopic hysterectomies; 3) recognize and avoid complications; and 4) learn various energy modalities.

Suturing

Charles H. Koh, M.D./Grace M. Janik, M.D., Moderators

This hands-on session is specially designed to learn advanced suturing techniques. A choreographed reproducible methodology will be taught by video demonstrations and laparoscopic suturing drills using laparoscopic trainers.

Objectives: I) Understand ergonomics, theory and rationale for reproducible laparoscopic suturing; 2) application of skills learned in relevant surgical situations; 3) manage bowel, bladder, and ureteral surgical complications and prevent delayed injury by appropriate suture repair, and 4) pre-test and post-test to demonstrate improvement in skills
