Workshop Description

Pelvic lymphadenectomy Radical hysterectomy

This workshop is designed for the gynecologic oncologist and general gynecologist who is versed in basic laparoscopic techniques, is familiar with open techniques and wants to advance his/her oncologic laparoscopic techniques. The didactic sessions address a review of retroperitoneal anatomy and several surgical techniques with emphasis on "how to" perform the operations. The presentations are geared to offer detailed practical information not included in surgical textbooks or atlases.

Rectosigmoidectomy with low colorectal

The hands-on sessions consists of the performance of the operations on unembalmed cadavers, duplicating an O.R. environment. No more than three participants are assigned to each cadaver and are closely supervised by experienced faculty, including some of the most outstanding physicians in the field. The faculty members are selected based on surgical experience as well as expertise in teaching in this setting. During each hour of hands-on experience with the cadaver,

each pariticpant will operate, assist and observe. With this rotational format, participants learn in a meaningful manner. The hands-on lab is limited to 27 so enroll early to sercure your spot.

Course Objectives

At the completion of this workshop, the practicing physician will be able to:

- 1) Identify the anatomy and techniques to access lateral pelvic spaces.
- 2) Describe techniques for parametrial ureteral dissection.
- 3) Select patients with cervical cancer for trachelectomy.
- 4) Discuss benefits and results of laparoscopy for patients with endometrial cancer.
- 5) Discuss applications of laparoscopy for patients with ovarian cancer.
